"Like me, Angie and Ruth have been around the globe once or twice, and they never failed to keep their sense of humor, work ethic, loyalty to each other, friends and family, no matter how dysfunctional. In fact, it was Angie who once told me she put the 'fun'; in dysfunctional," the late Cynthia Lennon writes in a special foreword.

Dr. McCartney shares a variety of experiences from her colorful life including opening a dessert wine company, performing a stint in the improv. comedy world in Hollywood with National Lampoon's Lemmings, and even delving into the world of artificial intelligence and learning more about the ever-changing world of cyberspace. Your Mother Should Know also has an appealing bonus feature: QR codes that readers can scan with their smart-phones to link to audio and video clips pertaining to the stories, adding hours of entertainment for all generations.

Liverpool-born Angie McCartney published her first book at almost 83 years old, and several years later, is publishing again! She turned 90 in November 2019, the same month her second book, Your Mother Should Know was released, and is already planning her 91st birthday celebration—if her past parties are any indication, it should be quite a bash!

In reflecting on the events of her life, Angie jokes that she is making plans to leave her brain behind, plugged in to AI, when she finally "pops her clogs", and figures that if Eleanor Rigby could leave her face in a jar by the door, she might do the same with her brain (maybe it'll be a bigger jar, though).
